

**Activity: Basic Salsa** 

**Themes: Dance Styles, Dance Skills** 

**Elements of dance: body, relationships** 

- 1. As a class, view the clip, *Salsa*, where Sammy teaches Salsa lessons to older members of the community. Discuss the origins of Salsa dancing and the different forms that this style of dance can take. Salsa is a pattern of six steps danced over eight counts of music.
- Additionally, the class could view the film <u>Take the Lead</u>. The film shows Antonio Banderas
  dancing the Tango and demonstrates to students the quality of the movement needed for
  this style of dance. (Be sure to check that the film rating and content is appropriate for your
  class).
- 3. Salsa dance routine: Select appropriate Salsa music to accompany the dance practice. Demonstrate basic Salsa movements. Divide the class into pairs and ask each pair to practice the steps and how to hold their partner. Basic Salsa movements are available at: Learn to dance Salsa, Basic Steps for Beginners.
- 4. Record the practice session of each pair and play it back to them so that they can evaluate what they need to do to improve their dance skills.
- 5. Ask students to complete Student Activity Sheet E14.1: Basic Salsa Steps.
- Have students write a journal entry, recalling the Salsa steps and using words that describe the feeling of the dance experience.
