Clip: Backstage Episode 6: Perfection

Activity: Behind the Scenes

Theme: Dance Knowledge

Producing artistic product requires many people and much time devoted to its development and presentation. Consider the enormous number of roles for people involved in the development of a large scale production, such as a school musical, or a show at a large city theatre.

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- 1. As a class, brainstorm and list any large productions that the students have been involved with or know about. Have students list on the whiteboard the roles, responsibilities and duties of the people who work on the production.
- 2. Divide the class into small groups. Each group is designated a list of roles that represent the management phases of the production, for example, the actors and understudies, the artistic direction including stage designers, costume designers, the back stage crew, the producer/director/theatre manager, promotions and advertising. Each member of the group is to be assigned a role to research and become familiar with.
- 3. Play 'Hot Seat' role play:
 - a. Make a list of the roles of each worker and write them on a strip of paper, cut these up and put all roles into a 'hat'.
 - b. Each student selects one strip of paper but doesn't show anyone else. Individually, they could research the role before playing the game.
 - c. Each student is called to the 'hot seat' and the rest of the students can ask five questions of them.
 - d. At the end of the five questions the class has one chance to guess the role of the 'hot seat' participant.
 - e. If the class guesses correctly, they get a point. If they don't, then the person gets the point.

- 4. Each student is to develop a job description for the role that they researched. The job description should include duties required, qualifications, work hours, prior experience, pay rate, and remunerations for productivity.
