

**Activity: Shakespeare in Dance** 

**Themes: Dance Knowledge** 

- 1. As a class, view the clip, *Shakespeare in Ballet*, where it is the school camp and the students learn about, and perform, the choreography for *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.
- 2. As a class, list what the students already know about William Shakespeare. Try to draw from the students when Shakespeare lived, what his occupation was, what plays he wrote, who he was married to, who was queen at the time, what was the era like in which he lived. Once the students have offered suggestions for each question ask them to research the correct answers and list these facts beside their suggestions. Particularly, list the plays that Shakespeare wrote, including Hamlet, Macbeth, Twelfth Night, Julius Caesar, Romeo and Juliet, King Lear, As You Like It, Much Ado About Nothing, The Merry Wives of Windsor, The Tempest, All's Well That Ends Well.
- 3. As a class, discuss why a Shakespearean play might be suitable for dance. Have students research which Shakespearean plays have been adapted for ballet or dance works. (For example, Romeo and Juliet, A Midsummer Night's Dream, The Taming of the Shrew, Othello, The Tempest and Hamlet.)
- 4. Ask students to independently research a dance adaptation of a Shakespearean play. Have them use **Student Activity Sheet E17.2**: **Shakespeare in Dance** to compile their research which should contain the following information:
  - a. The name of the ballet/dance work
  - b. Which Shakespearean play it was inspired by
  - c. Which company performed it
  - d. When and where it was performed
  - e. Who the lead dancers were and what characters they played
  - f. Include where possible an image of the performance (photocopy from a book or download an image from online)
  - g. The name of the choreographer
