# **Activity: The Audition Process**

### Theme: Dance Knowledge

- 1. In this clip, *The Audition*, Tara is auditioning for the National Academy of Dance in Sydney (a fictitious school). It is a full-time dance school that offers three years of tuition. It is incredibly selective and competition is high. Across Australia there are many full-time courses. All offer a range of styles but most specialise in one, such as ballet (Australian Ballet School, Victorian College of the Arts) or Indigenous Dance (National Aboriginal Islander Skills Development Association (NAISDA) Dance College). Discuss the following points with students, using the resources below. Have students use the internet as a guide to find the information they need. As a class:
  - a. Create a list of full-time dance schools in your state or territory: (1) Include the focus of the course, (2) What type of dance courses they offer, and (3) the type of dance they focus on, for example, commercial dance, music theatre, ballet, Hip Hop or another dance style?
  - b. View the clip, *The Audition*, and discuss the audition process for Tara's school, The National Academy of Dance.
  - c. View the *Dance Academy Auditions Acting Workshops* clip from the Dance Academy (first year) website [Select 'Backstage' menu, Behind the Scenes Menu and then play clip # 7] and discuss the actor's audition.
  - d. Discuss how the 'content' of an audition may vary according to the content of the course/production. What would be the same in all auditions (i.e. forms, warming up, technique classes)? What would be different? (i.e. improvisation, an actor's workshop, singing a set piece, learning a piece of choreography, an interview)
- After discussing the number and range of full-time dance schools, ask students to break into pairs and design an audition for first year students. Ask students to refer to the Student Activity Sheet: E1.1 The Audition Process.
